June 24: ONTARIO/MEXICO. Fly this afternoon from Ontario Airport (ONT) to Leon Airport (code BJX) and transfer to Guanajuato City, where you will be met and taken to the Hotel Luna, opened in 1892. The property has kept a captivating colonial and historical appearance, a signature element of the best hotel in Guanajuato, and houses an impressive artwork collection by local artists.

June 25: GUANAJUATO. Your tour of Guanajuato, one of the most important colonial cities of the 16th-18th centuries, includes a visit to the University, Basilica, Juarez Theater, Union Garden, Alhondiga, Hidalgo Market and Callejon del Beso (alley of the kiss). [B, L or D]

June 26: SAN MIGUEL DE ALLENDE, VIA DOLORES HIDALGO AND ATOTONILCO

Enjoy a day tour to the beautiful historic colonial town of Dolores Hidalgo. Mexico's "George Washington." Father Miguel Hidalgo gave the official cry for freedom here, and the War for Independence began. Today the town is justly known as a center for the design and fabrication of the popular Talavera ceramics. Dolores is also famous for its exotic ice creams.

Continue to one of the most beautiful colonial cities in Mexico, San Miguel de Allende. There is a blessed absence of traffic lights, billboards, and neon in this national monument town of 65,000 people. The town square is the home of the San Miguel Parish Church, the Museum home of General Don Ignacio Allende and the best stores, restaurants, night spots, cultural and historical places. June 27: SAN MIGUEL DE ALLENDE San Miguel de Allende is featured by Conde Nast Traveler as the 7th best travel destination in the world! It is home to endless art galleries, great craft shops, a wonderful variety of restaurants, and language schools - all contributing to the lasting popularity with sophisticated international tourists. Enjoy a relaxed guided stroll around town today to visit the major sites, including prominent plazas and the imposing Gothic cathedral. [B, L or D]

June 28: SAN MIGUEL DE ALLENDE VINEYARD TOUR San Miguel de Allende is home to several beautiful vineyards and wineries that offer tours, tastings, and a Colonial Cities chance to enjoy the stunning landscapes of the region. Enjoy wine tastings and a restaurant featuring dishes that pair well with their wines. The views of the surrounding landscape are breathtaking. [B, L or D]

June 29: SAN MIGUEL DE ALLENDE (GUADALUPE and LA AURORA NEIGHBORHOODS). Guadalupe and La Aurora are two vibrant neighborhoods in San Miguel De Allende, each offering unique experiences, art, culture, and charm. The Guadalupe neighborhood, often referred to simply as "Guadalupe," is known for its artistic vibe, colorful streets, and local culture. It is home to a mix of locals and expatriates, making it a lively and welcoming area. Stroll through the colorful streets, and visit local shops and galleries.

La Aurora is an artsy district located near the center of San Miguel de Allende. It was once an old textile factory but has been transformed into a hub for artists, galleries, and creative spaces. La Aurora is renowned for its numerous galleries featuring contemporary and traditional art. Fábrica La Aurora: This is the main attraction in the area-a beautifully restored textile factory that now houses art galleries, design shops, and restaurants. It's a great place to explore and discover local talent. [B, L or D]

June 30: TRANSFER TO OUERETARO/OUERETARO CITY TOUR. Transfer to the captivating capital of the state, Querétaro City, characterized by colonial architecture and charm. In 1810, Querétaro was recognized as a state, and in 1847, the city of Querétaro became the capital of the Republic. This is where Mexico and the United States signed a peace treaty. We have a day to explore this wonderful city. Admire the beautiful aqueducts with 74 arches, the Convent of San Francisco, the Regional Museum, the Santa Clara church, the Convent of the Cross with its famous tree, and many Baroque Mexican-style buildings. Visit the hill where the French Emperor Maximiliano made his last stand against the Liberal Army. GRAN HOTEL [B, L or D]
